

Identify

- Case
 - Student/Staff/Visitor?
- 2. Symptoms
 - COVID-19 symptoms: fever (≥37.5°C), cough, body ache or fatigue, shortness of breath, sore throat, runny nose, diarrhea and nausea, headache, or loss of sense of smell or taste
- 3. Location
 - Where has the case been detected Building and exact location
- 4. Identifier
 - The person identified who identified the case should make themselves known and inform the Health and Safety Officer on 056-808-5534 contact number available 24/7

Notify

1. <u>The Health and Safety Officer will contact the DHA hotline number 800-342 immediately and any other relevant contacts</u>

Act

- 1. The Health and Safety Officer will then ask the patient to remain in that location /or direct this individual to a remote location away from the public if it is safe to do so.
- 2. The Health and Safety Officer will wear the appropriate PPE and make his way to meet the patient.
- 3. The Health and Safety Officer will use cordons and portable screens to secure the area

Isolate

- 1. The Health and Safety Officer will assist the patient to reach the isolation room.
- 2. The Health and Safety Officer will contact on-site security to assist with making a free way towards the isolation room.
- 3. The Health and Safety Officer will make contact with DHA for further advice and assistance.

 Based on the patient condition, H&S will assess and make a judgment call if an ambulance is required at that stage
- 4. The Health and Safety Officer will ensure track and tracing reports are available and ready, should they be required
